Pupil Premium Report

The pupil premium for each financial year is allocated to schools with pupils on roll in the previous January who are known to have been eligible for free school meals at any time in the last six years. It is also allocated for any 'Children Looked After' or who have been adopted from care within the UK. At Reed First School, we use the Pupil Premium Grant in a range of ways to raise the attainment of the most vulnerable pupils and to ensure equal access to all aspects of school life.

Barriers that children in receipt of pupil premium may face are: attachment issues and other emotional needs; financial restraints preventing access to the wider opportunities, such as residential trips and music; or a lack of resources at home to support learning. Between September 2015 and April 2016 the school received £3960 pupil premium money for 3 children.

These funds were spent on:

- Subsidising school trips to ensure all children benefited from the experience
- School swimming
- Additional learning resources for intervention groups
- Staff training to use the intervention resources
- Milk
- Emotional and social needs support
- Inclusion in after school clubs

Between September 2014 and April 2015, the school received £6600 for 5 children. These funds were spent on :

- Professional advice for emotional needs
- Subsidising school trips
- Subsidising school swimming
- Intervention with teaching assistants
- Special needs training for staff
- Provision of our Early Birds setting
- Milk
- Support for emotional and social needs
- Inclusions in after school clubs

As a result of this grant, the progress of children in receipt of the Pupil Premium Grant is in line with that of their peers or better. The most valuable impact to them is their inclusion in all aspects of school life and in extra-curricular provision. More detail is available from the Headteacher on request.
