

<p>A <b>timeline</b> shows information in <b>chronological order</b>. The oldest toys are on the left-hand side because they were invented first. The <b>newest</b> toys are on the right-hand side because they show the most recent toys.</p>			

<p><u>13<sup>th</sup> April 1570</u> Guy Fawkes is born in York, UK.</p> 	<p><u>24<sup>th</sup> March 1603</u> King James I is crowned King of England.</p> 	<p><u>20<sup>th</sup> May 1604</u> Guy Fawkes, Robert Catesby and some other men meet to discuss their plan to blow up the Houses of Parliament.</p> 	<p><u>March 1605</u> The group rent a cellar under the House of Lords. They hide 36 barrels of gunpowder.</p> 	<p><u>October 1605</u> Lord Monteaule receives a letter warning him not to attend the opening of Parliament.</p> 	<p><u>1<sup>st</sup> November 1605</u> King James I is shown the letter.</p> 	<p><u>5<sup>th</sup> November 1605</u> Guy Fawkes is arrested in the cellar under the Houses of Parliament. He is taken to the Tower of London.</p>
