The family of

will

- ensure that their child arrives at school on time, properly dressed and equipped and fit to learn;

- ensure that their child attends school every day unless there is good reason and inform the school on the first day of absence by 9.15am;
- support the school's policy for behaviour;
- encourage and support their home learning and follow the school's home learning policy;
- attend parent evenings to discuss their progress;
- be aware of what is happening in school and read all correspondence;
- let the school know about any concerns or problems that might affect our child's learning or behaviour;
- support the school's approach to online safety and not upload or add any images, video, sound or text that could upset or offend any member of the school community or bring the school name into disrepute;
- treat all members of staff, other parents, pupils and governors with respect.

- be calm around school and make good choices;

- move quietly around the school;
- treat the school buildings and school property with respect;
- wear the correct uniform at all times;

- be an excellent representative of the school at all times.

- provide regular information on what we aim to teach your child and arrange parent's evenings to discuss progress;
- provide clear policies and guidelines in all areas, including behaviour and home learning, and ensure that parents are kept fully informed of expectations;
- keep you informed of any incidents or medical issues in line with our Behaviour and Health and Safety policies;
- keep you informed about school activities through regular newsletters and notices in school and offer you opportunities to become involved in the daily life of the school.
