What will I do?

- Name, recognise and remember up to 10 shapes in French.
- Attempt to spell some of these shapes in French.
- Attempt to remember which shapes are **un** or **une**.
- Revise or learn numbers 1-5 in French.

Phonics & Pronunciation we will see: **OI** sound in **étoiles**

Silent Letters: The letter 's' is not pronounced in **triangles** and all the other shapes when they are in plural form. We will learn that when 's' is a final consonant it is nearly always a silent letter in French.

The normally silent 'x' in **deux** is pronounced in **deux ovales** but the 'x' almost sounds like a 'z'. This happens often in French when a word ending in 'x' is followed by a word starting with a vowel.

The word for a/an in French can be either **un** and **une** (these words are articles/determiners and tell us if the noun, the shape, is either a masculine or feminine noun. In French this is called the gender of the noun).
