Our aims to further develop the opportunities our children have to gain life skills continue!

We were thrilled to welcome Keep a Beat to Reed First School this month. Our children in Bysouth and Layton classes were able to have, what was in many cases, their first introduction to First Aid. Dinky Medics has been designed to help children understand what may happen if they get hurt or poorly. While our Junior Medics learnt about:

- * Calling 999
- * Spotting Hazards
- * Using a First Aid kit
- * Helping someone with a small cut or graze
- * Applying a bandage
- * Helping someone with a burn
- * Helping someone with a head injury

After such a successful event, we plan to offer this every year to see regular refreshers to ensure the knowledge we want our children to have is secure and as we call it in other curriculum areas 'sticky'.

The impact these sessions have are clear from what the children had to say afterwards which included a unanimous agreement that they would like to do the sessions every year to remember what to do.

You will notice from the diary dates that we have an event planned for our older children in Years 3 and 4 in June. This is our new Community Safety Event.
