
# The Owl - January 2025

As part of our staff training day at the beginning of January, we were focusing on mental health and wellbeing. I have recently qualified as our Senior Mental Health Lead and part of this has enabled me to reflect upon what we offer to support every part of our community.

Working together and supporting each other is certainly a huge factor in ensuring we have a positive culture around us. Being a small setting really helps us to get to know everyone quickly and we hope you recognise this in our school.



The model above is very useful in understanding how our experiences, feelings and behaviours are inseparably linked. The difference in our journey from positive experiences is very different to that of a negative starting point. We work hard as a school to help the children to see this too.

The positive therapeutic behaviour parent and carer workshop which took place on the 30<sup>th</sup> of this month also had a focus on wellbeing. While discussing how we support and teach positive behaviours, it was also crucial to recognise that it is much harder to help and support others if we don't take the time to look after ourselves. A strong message from the workshop was that all behaviours are exhibited for a reason. A change in behaviour is a sign that something has changed for that person and that they may need help and support to regulate and recognise the root of the change. The parents and carers who attended the workshop certainly understood this saying:

We will now disempower behaviours shown by using positive phrasing and reinforcement. We will notice positive behaviours and positive choices.

We want to work as a team.

We have been given good examples of strategies which we can use at home.

We will spend more time talking about how to make things better and what our next step: are.

## You shall go to the ball!


