Coffee and Catch Up

Huge thanks to those of you who came to my sessions. They are an informal chance to share experiences, thoughts and views about the school to help us to continuously be reflective and plan for the future.

The catch ups resulted in discussions around:



School lunches – we discussed portion sizes, the amount of carbs on the plate and pudding options. As a result, we are monitoring what is served carefully and looking into alternative providers.

Home learning – We discussed how some children want to do everything set and agreed, some more tasks at the end of EYFS to prepare for KS1 would be good. Also, more reminders from the teachers about what is a must and what is a 'if you would like to.'

Wellbeing support – the parents shared what they know the school does to support pupil mental health and resilience. This included: Regulation Stations, fidgets, the daily mile, awareness of the needs of other children and JIGSAW lessons. This demonstrated so well that what is embedded in school is being shared at home.
