Everywhere I look in school at the moment. I see such wonderful aspiration in what the staff and children want achieve. This to example of mark making and writing in Jackson class shows not only the great opportunities the

children are given but also the children's desire to learn. High quality teaching equips to children to access the curriculum; however, the children need to have that aspiration to want to use their new skills. From our youngest children aged three to our oldest aged nine, they show such wonderful behaviours for learning. These behaviours don't just happen, they come from the high expectations our staff have and the enthusiasm for learning which they share.

Visitors in school have commented on the engagement the children show in their learning. Pupils passing us with house point tokens are able to explain which value they have shown and why. Just today, a pupil in Bysouth class told me and my visitor that they had been doing extra reading to improve and so had shown aspiration. Our visitor was taken aback that a 5 year old understood this important value.

I also had the pleasure of watching a maths lesson in Layton class where the children were showing their mastery of multiplication facts to reason about maths. There was a real sense of working together in the room; in the discussions going on and the support given to each other when needed.

There is also some healthy competition among my spelling group to have the best handwriting in the school! Starting my day with such a hard working group is truly a pleasure!

A shared vision for our children to learn together, learn for life is clear to see - well done Team Reed!

#### News from Layton Class Time travellers

On Monday 21st November, we had a Viking Day!

We all dressed up as Vikings and had a day full of fun activities. Vikings used runes to write. We wrote our names in Viking runes using black paint, a sharpened stick and a piece of thin bark. Vikings liked to play a game called Hnefetafl. We used some fabric to draw our own Hnefetafl game board, and then made our own playing pieces using grey and red clay. We also made a copper pendant in the shape of Thor's hammer or a cross. Finally, we made our own Viking bracelets by twisting and tying pieces of wool together.

We were very lucky to have a live chat with a Viking expert. She answered lots of questions that we had about the Vikings and showed us some Viking artefacts like a shield, axe and chainmail armour, a helmet, pots and bones that Viking doctors would use. She also told us a story about how Thor lost his hammer, and how Loki helped him get it back. Lastly, she used rune stones to tell Harry's future. He is going to be a big and strong warrior, and die in battle – which apparently is great for a Viking!

Callum's favourite part was twisting the wool to make the bracelet "because I found it really calming."

Reggie and Jesse say "My favourite thing was making Hnefetafl because I liked playing the game afterwards."

Harry's favourite part was making the copper pendants "because I did it all on my own – I demonstrated independence!"
