One visitor in November was our Herts Improvement partner who supports the school by carrying out monitoring visits over the year.




This visit, focused on the teaching and learning in history across the school. Feedback included observations of;

- A range of resources such as artefacts and photos used to inspire pupils and challenge them to think critically.
- Pupils enjoy learning about history. They explained that 'each lesson has a main question' and that they 'enjoyed finding out about things from the past.'
- Teachers present subject matter clearly, used skilful questioning and made links to previous learning, eliciting appropriate and enthusiastic discussion from pupils.
- Pupils spoken to thrived on explaining what they had learnt and were accurate and articulate with their knowledge and vocabulary. They knew that history was 'something that happened a long time ago, but still history if it happened yesterday because it is in the past.'
- A range of high-quality interactive displays were seen in communal areas across the school. These
 displays celebrated key moments in living history, such as the coronation of the King, and pupils were
 proud to explain that 'the King has written to us, and before that we had two letters from the Queen.'

We are very lucky to have such an excellent team of teachers who have been deservedly recognised for ensuring high quality teaching. They also deeply care about the children in their care and the experiences they have. Remember you are welcome to visit your child's class and enjoy them sharing their learning with you.




Make a noise about bullying
