As you will know, schools can never remain still if they are to achieve and improve. This cannot come from just staff or just governors; but a collective view and vision for the school from the whole community.

Examples already of involving groups this school year, have seen parents invited to attend workshops and watch phonics lessons to help understand how to support early reading. We are keen to keep these open lessons as at least a termly event to include parents in our developments and priorities. Parents have shared their love for real books in supporting their child's reading at home, we listened and e-books have been set to one side for now.

Pupils have been asked by our school councillors whether they enjoy their time in the hall at lunch time or whether we can organise things differently. The children enjoy the chance to eat with their friends but have suggested calming music playing to keep voices quieter. They would also like the chance for older children to play outside for a little while rather than sitting and waiting for their lunch. Changes whether big or small can make all the difference! One of our school priorities this year is to look to the future and create a 5-year plan for further school improvement. I will be working with the staff and governors to decide how we would like this to
