Parent Voice

Thank you to those of you who took the time to respond to my questions around what you would like to discuss at our Parent Forums this term. For those of you who are new to the school, the idea of the forums is to get the perspective of the parents about various aspects of school life. For example, we have discussed before; how to improve the range of lunch choices and how to communicate the learning tasks set for home.

There were no particular issues or areas for discussion raised, but in my question around what you would like to know to support your child's learning, there were commonalities around making sure how you are working at home mirrors what happens in school. As a result, I would like to invite you to our first Parent Forum on **Tuesday 19th October**. I will run one session at **2.15pm – 3.15pm in the school hall** and a second session at **7.00pm – 8.00pm virtually through Google Meet**. These times reflect what the majority of parents who responded to my survey wanted as meeting times.

At this forum, I will be sharing in detail with you our policies for feedback, handwriting and presentation and our policy for English where I will give particular focus around our methodologies for teaching and learning phonics and spelling. These are in response to the areas identified in the survey.

I will also be looking to find out whether our communication with you gives you enough feedback to know how your child is progressing and whether targets and suggestions from teachers help you to mirror the support given at school to home learning. Talking with you about this after our first parent consultation of the year would be useful. This will take place on **Thursday 4th November**. I will again, run one session at **2.15pm – 3.15pm in the school hall** and a second session at **7.00pm – 8.00pm virtually through Google**
