Maths Methods Parent Workshop Monday 14th October 7 - 8pm

Support your understanding of the methods taught in school for addition and subtraction.

After our successful maths workshop last term, parents and carers who attended, expressed an interest in being shown how children calculate in order to help them secure methods at home.

At this next event, Miss Wilson and Mrs Dear will be leading lessons for you to engage with in their classrooms which will demonstrate the methods taught in Years 2, 3 and 4 in addition and subtraction.

You will also be reminded of our calculation policies which are available on our website in our maths curriculum section. The methods you see in these policies will be modelled and tried out by you.

We know that many parents across the country often comment that they were taught in such different ways. They also understandably revert to the methods they were taught as that is what they know! However, although as you will see many methods are the same, the steps we take to get those formal written methods particularly in Years 5 and 6 are broken up more with use of practical resources to help.

This event is open to all parents and carers across the school. The lessons will be taught twice so if you wish you can take part in both.
