What is the PE and Sport Premium?

The primary PE and sport premium was introduced in March 2013 to improve the provision of physical education and school sport in primary schools across England. The £150 million per year funding is provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health, and Digital, Culture, Media and Sport (DfE, DH, DCMS). The funding is allocated directly to primary schools and is ring-fenced. This means it may only be spent on improving the provision of PE and sport in schools. In February 2014 the government committed to continue the funding until 2020.

How much funding does Reed First School receive?

In the financial year 2017/18 our school received £12,872 from the Sport Premium funding. In 2018/19 this funding will increase to £16,000.

How did Reed First School spend this money in 2017/18?

<i>Activity</i>	<i>Impact / Outcome</i>
North Herts School Sports Partnership	Participation in the North Herts School Sports Partnership enabled our school to participate in a number of inter school competitions. The partnership promotes pupil involvement in sport and physical activity as a lifelong pattern and encourages pupils to respect everyone, value diversity and be committed to inclusion. The partnership also enables access to many sports and high quality coaches that would not otherwise be available to a small school such as ours.
Development of the role of P.E. Coordinator	Attendance at Sports Partnership cluster meetings and training sessions. Cascade training and information back to staff and keep Head Teacher updated.
Swimming	20 trips to the swimming pool at Ward Freeman in Buntingford were completed with pupils all transported by coach. Swimming is an excellent sport which promotes physical fitness, coordination and breathing control.
Sports Day	Encourages pupil participation in a range of events and instils pride in the school both with parents and the wider community.
Playground Equipment	The climbing frame has been re-painted following the laying of the new surface (the surface was paid for by a lottery grant). Playground equipment is important in the development of pupils' coordination and fitness activity and can act as an important focal point for social gatherings at break times.

How Did Reed First School Spend the Money in 2018/19?

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Daily Fitness - Infants	Designed to encourage and raise pupil awareness in the need to participate in regular physical activity. Began with “the daily mile” around the school sports field and later changed to “exercise to music” for the winter period.
Cricket	Years 1 – 4 enjoyed cricket on the school sports field under the tuition of a cricket coach. This provided valuable insight for pupils and allowed them not just to enjoy the game but to gain a deeper understanding of rules and techniques.
After School PE Club	An after school PE club was established to further develop pupils’ fitness and participation in physical activities. A list of desired PE equipment was purchased and this further improved this activity.
Zumba (Years 1 – 4)	Zumba was a dance-fitness class that encouraged pupils to engage in a physical, fitness activity that was fun as well as physical. This promoted wider participation and was designed to draw in pupils that may otherwise avoid more traditional sports related activities.

Sports Day	Our annual event encouraged pupil participation in a range of events and instilled pride in the school both with parents and the wider community.
Multisports	Years 1 – 4 took part in a programme of multisports under the expert eye of a trained coach. These sports were designed to promote physical coordination as well as overall fitness and encouraged wide participation and social interaction.
